Charles Bunton-Street Commissioner entered during the meeting.

Mayor Bowyer called the meeting to order and asked if there
was a motion to accept the minutes from the last regular meeting
and two special meetings as presented.

Mr. Johnston motioned seconded by Mr. Hanselman to accept the
minutes from the meetings held April 5, 16, and 18. Voting:
Johnston: YEA, Haneslman: YEA, Craig: YEA, Neu: YEA, Staggs:
YEA. Voting: NAY. None. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mayor Bowyer recognized the citizens from Scott and Clark
township and asked if they would like to address council.
Robert Thompson from Scott Township addressed Council and stated
that the residents of Scott Township did not want the lagoons
from the Hamesville Sewer System located in their township.
Mayor Bowyer addressed this issue and informed the residents
that a lagoon site had not been selected at this time and the
residents would be notified of any public meetings that would
be held.

After a long discussion Mayor Bowyer stated that the Sewer
Project discussion was over and no more questions would be
answered until the Engineer arrived.

A motion to with hold all further sewer questions and proceed
with the Village Business was made by Mr. Staggs seconded by
Mr. Neu. Voting: Staggs: YEA, Neu: YEA, Craig: YEA, Hanselman:
YEA, Johnston: YEA. Voting: NAY, None. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Officer Neel from the Hamersville Police Department was discussed
and the fact that Officer Neel has not attended any of the
classes at the Southern Hills Police Training. Council went
on record to instruct the Chief of the Hamersville Police
Department James Canter to send Officer Neel a written request
to either attend the classes or he will be asked to resign.
for the failure to obey instructions.

Solictior George Leicht introduced Mr. Ramey and presented
Mr. Ramey's request to have his drive way repaired from when
the water line was installed to the Layman Property on Sodom
Road.

Mayor Bowyer referred this to Mr. Hanes from the Board and asked

him to take care of this matter.

Mr. Hanes replied that he and Mr. Saylor would meet with Mr. Ramey and see what needed to be done.

Mayor Bowyer asked Council what they wanted to do about the grass cutting Ordinance 1988-7.

Mr. Hanselman motioned to ammend ORDINANCE 1988-7 and make changes in section 4 (FOUR) Reading from two (2) months to one (1) month.

Seconded by Ms. Craig. Voting: Hanselman: YEA, Craig: YEA, Johnston: YEA, Neu: YEA, Staggs: YEA. Voting: NAY: None. MOTION CARRIED.

ORDINANCE 1988-7 will be ammended to become ORDINANCE 1993-15

A motion to suspend the rules and declare this an emergency and give second and third reading by title only was made by Mr. Hanselman seconded by Ms. Craig. Voting: Hanselman: YEA, Craig: YEA, Johnston: YEA, Neu: YEA, Staggs: YEA. Voting: NAY: None. MOTION CARRIED

Mayor Bowyer asked for a motion to adopt ORDINANCE 1993-15

Mr. Neu motioned seconded by Mr. Staggs. Voting: Neu: YEA, Staggs: YEA, Craig: YEA, Hanselman: YEA, Johnston: YEA. Voting: NAY: None. MOTION CARRIED. (ORDINANCE 1993-15 WILL BECOME PART OF THESE MINUTES.)

Mayor Bowyer asked for a report from the committee to get price quotes on the roof repair for the Village Buildings on Mill Street. The Committee reported that they had been unable to obtain price quotes at this time.

Mayor Bowyer presented ORDINANCE 1993-13

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CLERK TO EXECUTE DOCUMENTS TO BORROW \$11,999.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF PURCHASING A POLICE CRUISER AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Hamersville, Brown County, Ohio, at least three fourths of its members concurring:

Section: 1 That the Village Clerk is hereby authorized to execute documents to borrow \$11,999.00 for the purpose of purchasing a police car.

Section 2. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the reason that the purchase of a police car directs affects the health safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of Hamersville.

Mayor Bowyer reported that he needed to attend a training session on DUI'S to be held on October 9, 1993. The fee will be Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) Mr. Hanselman motioned to pay the fee, seconded by Mr. Neu. Voting: Hanselman: YEA, Neu: YEA, Craig: YEA, Johnston: YEA, Staggs: Yea. Voting: NAY: None. MOTION CARRIED.

Mayor Bowyer proclaimed the week of May 9, 1993 as Small Business week in the village of Hamersville.

Mayor Bowyer proclaimed May 6, 1993 as World Day of Prayer in the Village of Hamersville.

Mayor Bowyer presented Resolution 1993-14 A RESOLUTION CREATING A SEWER FUND IN THE VILLAGE OF HAMERSVILLE.

A motion to adopt RESOLUTION 1993-14 was made by Mr. Johnston seconded by Mr. Neu. Voting: Johnston: YEA, Neu: YEA, Craig: YEA, Hanselman YEA, Staggs: YEA. Voting: NAY: None. MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Neu reported that he has been trying to reach Bruce Branstetter in regards to the C.D.B.G. and has not reached his at this time.

Mayor Bowyer asked if there was a report on the Speed Limit signs for the village and the Clerk reported that she had not received an answer from ODOT. Mayor Bowyer suggested that she contact ODOT again in regard to these signs.

Police Department reported that the Village's Radar unit was broken and asked for permission to get it repaired. Mr. Hanselman motioned seconded by Mr. Neu to have the radar unit repaired. Voting: Hanselman: YEA, Neu: YEA, Craig: YEA, Johnston: YEA, Staggs: YEA. Voting: Nay: None. MOTION CARRIED.

The mass mailing on the sewer project was tabled until a later date.

George Leicht discussed Dooley Alley and since it was never dedicated the Village would need to have easements from adjoining property owners and the alley would have to be brought up to standards before the Village could make it a street.

Mr. Bunton reported on the Village Streets and gave his work report.

There was no report from the Committee to study the Employee Performance Evaluation Report.

A request was made to have the police patrol from the area around State Route 774 and 125 near the J AND M Carry Out.

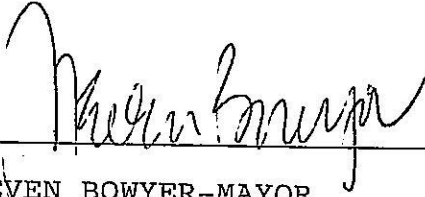
Mr. Hanselman to notify Rumpke Waste Removal.
