Present: Mayor Steven Bowyer, Clerk Treasurer Martha Hanes, and Council Members; William Dean Jr, Patrick Hanselman, James Johnston, Duane Neu, and Wyndal Staggs.

Mayor Bowyer called the meeting to order and asked for a motion to accept the minutes as presented. A motion was made by Mr. Staggs seconded by Mr. Dean to Approve the minutes as presented. Voting: Staggs: YEA, Dean: YEA, Hanselman: YEA, Johnston: YEA, Neu: YEA. Voting: NAY: None. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mayor Bowyer introduced Bruce Brandstetter who discussed the the applications for C.D.B.G. And State Issue 11 funds and how the Village would have to apply to receive any of these funds Applications for these funds are due in the fall and if the village wants to apply they will need to start working on them now. Mr. Brandstetter stated that there are Federal Grants and "0" interest Loans for Sewers and Sewer Treatment facilities which could make a sewer system affordable in the Village. Mr. Brandstetter recommends that the Village keep their sewer system in the Corporate limits of the Village.

Mr. Bob Neu spoke on the Hamersville Sewers and after a few comments Mayor Bowyer told Mr. Neu the sewer discussion was over.

Mayor Bowyer recognized Ms. Janice Bowman who had a petition from the residents on Sisterville Road requesting that the Village place Twenty Five Mile Per Hour Speed Limit Signs up due to the large number of children living in this area.

After a discussion from council Mayor Bowyer instructed the Clerk to have the Street Commissioner install the signs.

Mayor Bowyer recognized Mr. Monty Hagle who lives on Cemetery Road who said he just wanted it to be on record that he wants sewers and so do his neighbors.

Mayor Bowyer requested that the Board of Public Affairs allow enough room in the building where the utility truck is parked to keep the old police cruiser.  
The ditch behind the Church of Christ needs to be corrected and a NO PARKING SIGN NEEDS TO BE INSTALLED BY THE CHURCH OF CHRIST.

RESOLUTION 1993-17

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO AGREEMENT WITH BRANDSTETTER/CARROLL, INC. FOR THE PROVISION OF TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FOR GRANT APPLICATION DEVELOPMENT. Whereas, the Village of Hamersville has decided to apply for Community Development Block (CDBG) Funds thru the Formula Program administered by the Brown County Board of Commissioners: and Whereas, the Village lacks the technical capabilities to develop and complete the grant application; and Whereas, the firm of Brandstetter/Carroll had demonstrated to the Villages satisfaction that they can provide the necessary technical services at a fee satisfactory to the Village, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the council of the Village of Hamersville that:

- (1) The Mayor be authorized to enter into an agreement with Brandstetter/Carroll, Inc. for the provision of technical services for grant application for CGBD Formula Program Funds.
- (2) The terms and provisions of the agreement shall be those as attached to and made a part of this Resolution.
