

Village of Hamensville
Regular Council Meeting
May 4, 1992 7:00 P.M.

Present were Mayor Steven Bowyer, Clerk Treasurer Martha Hanes, Council members William Dean Jr., James Johnston, Wyndal Staggs, Terry Stephens.

Also present Mack Hanes Jesse Nester, and Edward Martin of the Board of Public Affairs and James K. Carter Chief of Police and Officers Betty Kirkpatrick and Wayne Blanton.

Many Hanselman, Pauline Thornton, Philip Thornton, William Helton, Annas Helton, Roger Adkins, Robert Dameron from Society Bank, George Leicht Village Solicitor and Eugene O'Brein and Eugene Worthington.

Mayor Bowyer called the meeting to order and asked for a motion to accept the minutes from the March 22, 1992 meeting. A motion to accept the minutes as presented was made by Stephens, seconded by Johnston. Voting: Stephens - YEA, Johnston - YEA, Dean - YEA, Staggs - YEA. Voting Nay - None **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mayor Bowyer then asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the April 6, 1992 meeting as presented; Johnston motioned Staggs seconded motion to accept minutes as presented. Voting: Staggs - YEA, Johnston - YEA, Dean - YEA, Stephens - YEA. Voting Nay None. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mayor Bowyer recognized Mary Hanselman and she questioned the council and the Mayor about the need for a traffic light at State Route's 125 and 774. Mayor Bowyer explained that he was supposed to draft a letter to Cooper Snyder and Doug White and the Ohio Dept. of Transportation in regards to obtaining a traffic light. Solicitor Leicht stated that in order to obtain a traffic signal we must first make an application and have a traffic survey done.

Many thanked the council for their time, and returned to her seat.

Mr. William Helton addressed the council about Dooley Ave. and the need for repairs on it. There is no record of Dooley Ave. having been accepted as a street in the Village. The street committee to look at Dooley Ave. and report back at the June 1992 meeting. The Helton's and Thorntons thanked the council for their time and left the meeting.

Mayor Bowyer introduced ordinance 1992-6 An ordinance providing for the issuance of \$30,000 of notes by the Village of Hamensville, Ohio in Anticipation of the the issuance of bonds for the purpose of improving streets in the Village. This was the first reading.

Mayor Bowyer then introduced Ordinance 1992-4 an ordinance setting the electric rates changed to the Village of Hamensville. This was the third reading for this ordinance and Mayor

Bowyer asked for a motion to adopt at this time; Johnston made a motion to adopt ordinance 1992-4 seconded by Dean. Voting: Johnston - YEA, Dean - YEA, Staggs - YEA, Stephens - YEA. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mr. Johnston needs the lumber so he can complete the signs with park name. There will be two signs one on Worcester Ave. and the other on Mill St. There will also be a small metal sign on the corner of Mill and Main St. to show where the park is located.

The Board of Public Affairs was asked if they had any problems with the council using the Chippen to clean in the park and they reported they had no problems since all the property belonged to the village.

Dale Fite entered at 8:30 P.M. and presented the Fire and Emergency contract between Hamensville and Lewis Township. This will be Ordinance 1992-7. This is the first reading for 1992-7.

Mayor Bowyer Gave The Mayors report at this time and discussed the date for dedicating the park. The date has been set for July 11, 1992.

Council discussed how to handle the skateboard problem in the Village and asked the Solicitor to draw an ordinance banning skateboards in the Village.

Chief Canter gave the police report and said that the Police Department had spent unlimited time dealing with skateboards on the sidewalks and streets and even on the roof of the school building.

Mayor Bowyer asked if there was a motion to pay the bills as presented. Johnston motioned, Staggs seconded motion to pay bills. Voting: Johnston - YEA, Staggs - YEA, Dean - YEA, Stephens - YEA. Voting Nay None. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mr. O'Brien and Mr. Worthington spoke on behalf of the sewers and stated that the Village's next step would be to file the Preliminary Specs. and Data and to form a sewer district. The Russellville District was given to the Village Solicitor to have checked and reported on. Mr. O'Brien said he would file the Preliminary Engineering report with the F.H.A. The Village will need to set aside \$200.00 (Two Hundred Dollars) Land option money. A motion was made by Dean seconded by Johnston to set this land option money aside. Voting: Dean - YEA, Johnston - YEA, Staggs - YEA, Stephens - YEA. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mayor Bowyer asked if there was any further business to come before the meeting at this time, hearing none Stephens motioned, Dean seconded motion to adjourn. Voting: Stephens - YEA, Dean - YEA, Johnston - YEA, Staggs - YEA. Voting NAY None **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mayor Bowyer adjourned the meeting reminding everyone the next regular meeting will be Monday June 1, 1992 at 7:00 P.M.
