Board of Public Affairs
Regular Meeting
April 19, 1993 7:00 P. M.

Present: Mack Hanes, William Dean Sr. Edward Martin, Martha Hanes-Clerk Treasurer.

Also Present: Mayor Steven Bowyer, Lynn Dunn, Kay Elliott, Colby Saylor and Joshua Wagner.

President Hanes called the meeting to order and recognized Joshua Wagner who lives on Fite Ave. Mr. Wagner was present to discuss the tile in his driveway and what he needs to do to have it repaired. Mr. Wagner was told that the Village has an Ordinance regulating the kind and size culverts that he must install.

President Hanes asked for a motion to accept the minutes from the previous meetings as presented. Mr. Hanes motioned to accept the minutes as presented; seconded by Mr. Martin voted and carried.

Mr. Martin motioned to pay the bills as presented; this was seconded by Mr. Hanes. Voted and carried.

Mayor Bowyer discussed with the Board the need to establish a Sewer Trust Fund. Mr. Hanes presented RESOLUTION 1993-14. **A RESOLUTION CREATING A SEWER TRUST FUND FOR THE VILLAGE OF HAMERSVILLE.**

Mr. Martin motioned to accept RESOLUTION 1993-14 seconded by Mr. Dean. Voting: MARTIN: YEA, DEAN: YEA, HANES: YEA. Voting: NAY: None. **MOTION CARRIED.**

There was a discussion on the dumpsters located in the Village and the fact that they are now locked. The locks were placed on the dumpsters by Rumpke Waste Removal due to the fact that Rumpke monitored the garbage in the dumpsters and found unlimited garbage from residents of the township who are not paying garbage fees. Rumpke Waste told the village that they would be billing these people direct.

The Board of Public Affairs wants to go on record that they did not have any thing to do with the locks on the dumpsters.

Mr. Dunn has received a price quote from the firm that removes old transformers and Mr. Dunn said he would contact the firm again in regards to the old transformers that the village has. Mr. Dunn will get more information and report back at the next regular meeting.

Mr. Dunn also questioned the Emergency Light Fund and asked how soon we will start putting money into this fund.

The Board told Mr. Dunn that they would check this out and see when this could be done.

Mr. Saylor reported that he would be setting some new meters soon and was trying to get some proper readings on the meter at the top of Georgetown hill. Mr. Dean suggested that we keep

trying to get a handle on the amount of water that we are being billed for.

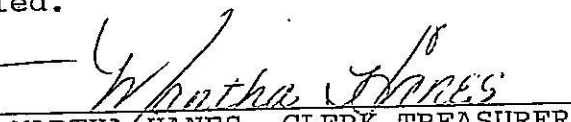
Mr. Saylor and Mr. Dean to look at the water meter and the valve on Georgetown Hill in the next few days.
