VILLAGE OF HAMERSVILLE

REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING

SEPTEMBER 10, 1990 - 7:00 P.M.

Mayor Bowyer called the meeting to order and asked for approval of the minutes of the August 6, 1990 meeting. Hanes moved to approve the minutes. Moore seconded the motion. **VOTING:** YEA: Hanes, Moore, Elliott, Hanselman, Staggs, Stephens. NAY: None **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mayor Bowyer brought Council up-to-date on park project. All bids have been submitted. Commissioners accepted the sidewalk bid. However, we need another bid on excavation. Also, the invoice for the installation of the water line has to be submitted. We have 30 days, after we receive the money, to have sidewalks and excavation completed.

Mayor Bowyer informed Council that the Police Committee held a meeting after Court, Wednesday Night, September 4th. The Village currently has a problem with police coverage since Don Fore is on sick leave and not available to work. The Police Chief does not know how long Don will be on sick leave. The Police Committee recommends to Council to move Betty Kirkpatrick from Auxiliary Police Officer to part-time Police Officer with a minimum of 20 hours per month. Committee also recommends placing an ad in the paper for auxiliary and part-time police officer. The rate of pay for Betty would be \$4.85 per hour.

Discussion followed. Due to the urgency of the situation, Moore moved to suspend the rules and read by Title only, Ordinance No. 1990-21 Moving Betty Kirkpatrick from Auxiliary status to Part-time Police Officer for a period of 3 months at the hourly rate of \$4.85. Hanselman seconded the motion. **VOTING:** Moore, Yea; Hanselman, Yea; Elliott, Yea; Stephens, Yea; Staggs, Yea; Hanes, Yea. NAY: None **MOTION CARRIED.**

Hanes made the motion to adopt Ordinance No. 1990-21. Moore seconded the motion. **VOTING:** Hanes, Moore, Elliott, Hanselman, Staggs, Stephens. NAY: None **MOTION CARRIED.**

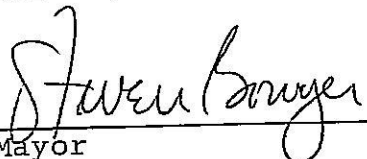
Discussion followed on Rumpke increasing Village monthly rate from \$642.19 to \$702.80 due to surcharge. Solicitor Leicht has written a letter Rumpke regarding this matter. Solicitor Leicht will contact State Auditor's office in this matter and advised Clerk-Treasurer to pay only \$642.19 per month until further notice. Solicitor Leicht is concerned the Auditor's Office will issue a Finding for Recovery against the Village Clerk. Mayor Bowyer told Council he had been approached by representatives of the Western Brown Schools concerning the fence line between School and certain property owners on Travis. They requested

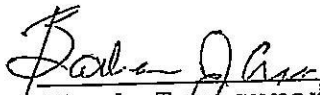
Village get a public easement from each property owner and the school would clean out fence line and install a nice drainage ditch. Following discussion, it was consensus of opinion that this was not a matter for village involvement. This is a situation between school authorities and each property owner.

Police Chief Canter gave his report for August.

Moore moved, Staggs seconded the motion to pay the bills as presented.
