Regular Village Council Meeting
October 14, 2002

Present: Mayor Duane C. Neu, Diana Shuemake, Betty Kirkpatrick, Wyndal Staggs, Larry Talbott and Clerk Treasurer Tammie Ogle.

Also Present: Village Solicitor Cecelia Potts, Art Hunter, Jesse Green, Kenny Green, Crystal Haas, Jared Riley, Lonny Riley, Jim Canter, Kris Cooper and Steve McKinney.

Mayor Neu called this meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., and then led the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Neu then recognized Kris Cooper, who came in to discuss his water and sewer situation. He has begun the paperwork to annex into the Village.

The Clerk Treasurer presented the minutes of the previous meeting. Ms. Kirkpatrick made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Ms. Shuemake seconded the motion, and the motion carried, all members voting yes.

Ms. Kirkpatrick made a motion to pay all bills as presented. Mr. Talbott seconded the motion, and the motion carried, all voting yes.

Mayor Neu read Ordinance 2002-05, the Adelphia Franchise, for the first time. Mr. Talbott made a motion to adopt this, and Ms. Kirkpatrick seconded the motion. The motion carried, all members voting yes.

Ms. Potts received a letter from Brandstetter and Carroll. She will have Mr. Brandstetter come to our next regular Council Meeting.

Mr. Staggs informed the Council that Rumpke will not pick up the trash at the blue house on Main Street. They need the limbs cut up and bundled. The Rumpke driver also wants help to load the trash.

Mr. Staggs then brought up the decision last month to make Wooster a one way street. The Police Department is not in favor of the decision. Mr. Staggs made a motion to rescind the motion to make it one way, and Ms. Kirkpatrick seconded the motion. The motion carried, all members voting yes.

Mr. Talbott made a motion to have Beggar's Night on October 31st, from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Ms. Kirkpatrick seconded the motion, and it carried, all voting yes.

Mayor Neu then recognized Crystal Haas, who brought some more questions and some information about possible grant monies.

Mayor Neu asked Ms. Haas if she would be interested in the vacant council seat. When she answered in the affirmative, Mayor Neu appointed her to the seat and swore her in. Ms. Haas took a seat at the table.

Kenny Green told Council that he has the signs to put up. He wants someone from Environmental Engineering to come look at the pump station. He also has some problems with the truck that need fixed.

Chief Canter asked for a 35 m.p.h. sign for Fite Avenue. Kenny will put it up, as well as change the Street Signs on Travis so they both read Travis Place.

Mr. Staggs made a motion to train the Police Officers to reset the pump station breakers if they go out. Mr. Talbott seconded the

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motion, and the motion carried, all voting yes.

Mr. Ogle had suggested giving the white cruiser to the BPA to use as the meter reader's car. Mr. Talbott made a motion to do so, and Mr. Staggs seconded the motion. The motion carried, all voting yes. Chief Canter will order amber light covers and take care of taking out the police equipment.

Jesse is working a lot of hours at his regular full time job, and he does not have a lot of time to work here. Council has no real problems with this, since cold weather is coming, but want him to catch up on the work he has been putting off.

Chief Canter has \$550.00 for the Identakid kits, he needs \$914.00 all together. Mike Jones wants his picture taken with Peggy McKinney and Sheriff Wenninger, along with our Police Chief, giving them a check for \$250.00. They have also received donations from McKinney's for \$100.00, Schneider's for \$100.00 and Henson's for \$50.00. Ms. Potts told them to set up a trust account at the bank for the money. The Police Officers will donate their time to do this. They have also been donating their time to fingerprint parents at the school. They asked for a new telephone.

The Police Department thanked the Council for the new police cruiser.

Ms. Shuemaker complained about people keeping horses on Dooley. We have no ordinance against horses.

Mr. Talbott made a motion to go to Executive Session. Ms. Kirkpatrick seconded the motion, and the motion carried, all voting yes. Council asked the Police Department to stay.

Mr. Staggs made a motion to come out of Executive Session, and Ms. Kirkpatrick seconded the motion. Mr. Staggs made a motion to send letters to the Fire Chief and EMS Captain to inform them that the Police Department will start to enforce the Ordinance pertaining to lights and sirens on the Emergency vehicles. Ms. Haas seconded the motion, and the motion carried, all voting yes.

Mr. Staggs made a motion to adjourn, and Mr. Talbott seconded the motion. The motion carried, all voting yes.
