Special Council Meeting
April 18, 1994 - 6:30 P.M.

Mayor Bowyer called the meeting to order and explained the main purpose of this special meeting was to pass Resolution/Ordinance 1994-6. An Ordinance giving authority to the Ohio Department of Transportation to repair S.R. 774, mainly replacing three catch basins.

Neu moved to suspend the rules and read By Title Only, Ordinance 1994-6. Hanes seconded the motion. VOTING: YEA: Neu, Hanes, Johnston, Nester, Staggs. NAY: None, MOTION CARRIED.

Following discussion, Hanes moved to adopt Ordinance 1994-6. Staggs moved to adopt Ordinance 1994-6. VOTING: YEA: Hanes, Staggs, Johnston, Nester, Neu. NAY: None, MOTION CARRIED.

Brown County Deputy Sheriff, Richard Nehus was present to enlighten Council somewhat on "Junk Car" ordinance which is already in the Anderson's Basic Code of Ordinances. Village can put a lien on property if owner does not remove junk car(s) ten (10) days after being served with a notice. Discussion followed on terminology of "Junk Car".

Mayor Bowyer said our Solicitor is currently working on updating our Ordinance for junk car(s), removal, regulations, etc. Mayor Bowyer also said Police Chief Canter will follow through on removal of junk car(s) after we have the updated Ordinance from Solicitor Leicht.

Mayor Bowyer informed Council that he has signed the agreement with the SYET Program for Village's participation this summer.

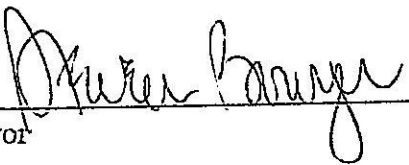
Councilman Johnston brought up the subject of a radar unit for the white cruiser. He said the Police Department uses both cruisers on the weekends. However, since the white cruiser does not have radar, its impossible to verify speeds of vehicles. Chief Canter informed Police Committee that Harry Martin can obtain a radar unit for \$450.00. The Police Committee feels this would be money well spent and recommended the purchase of the radar unit. Following Discussion, Johnston moved, Neu seconded the motion to purchase radar unit for \$450.00. VOTING: YEA: Johnston, Neu, Hanes, Nester, Staggs. NAY: None, MOTION CARRIED.

Mayor Bowyer informed Council that he had granted permission to Hamersville Daisy girl Scout Troop #4312 to plant a tree in Hannah Park on "Earth Day" which is April 22. Also, Kenny Green would be available if any assistance was needed.

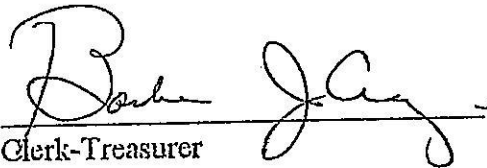
