

Village of Hamersville
Reconvened Meeting from March 1, 1993
Monday March 7, 1993 7:00 P.M.
202 Main Street Hamersville, Ohio 45130

Present: Mayor Steven Bowyer, Clerk Treasurer Martha Hanes, Council Members Cheryl Craig, William Dean Jr., Patrick Hanselman, James Johnston, Duane Neu and Wyndal Staggs. Also Present: Eunice Ott from the Brown County Press and Mack Hanes and Edward Martin from the Hamersville Board of Public Affairs. Present from the Hamersville Police Department were Chief James Canter, and Officers Wayde Blanton, Mike Rumping, Betty Kirkpatrick.

Mayor Bowyer reconvened the meeting which had been in recess since Monday March 1, 1993.

Mayor Bowyer presented a check from Ninichucks for a partial payment on the game permits due the village. This was discussed and according to the Ordinance Ms. Ninichuck must pay the full amount for the permits. Mayor Bowyer will return Ms. Ninichuck's check and explain to her what has to be done before she can obtain the permits.

Mayor Bowyer read a letter from Metropolitan Housing requesting the Councils support of obtaining Metropolitan Housing Grants within the Village. Mr. Dean motioned to support metropolitan Housing, seconded by Mr. Neu. Voting: Dean: YEA, Neu: YEA, Craig: YEA, Hanselman: YEA, Johnston: YEA, Staggs: YEA. Voting: NAY: None. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mayor Bowyer opened the discussion on the officers of the Hamersville Police Department being sent to school to update their training and Mike Rumping stated that he is in favor of the training however he questioned if all the classes were necessary and Mr. Staggs answered that this has already been decided and there is no need for further discussion.

Mr. Rumping then asked about extending the time limit so the officers would have more time to prepare to attend.

Chief Canter said he is in favor of the training however he would not be against extending the time limit since this was a rather short notice.

Ms. Craig apologized to the police department for her lack of knowledge about the training and asked if the schooling was being done for the betterment of the Village and not to get rid of any of the officers.

Mike Rumping would like to attend some of the classes however he cannot attend them all. Mr. Staggs stated that he had no problem with the village paying for the classes that Mr. Rumping wants to attend; however the village will have to know tonite who is going to attend and the number of hours they will be attending so the fees can be sent in. The following officers needs one hundred and thirty two hours (132) Canter, Neel, Blanton, Riley. Officer Kirkpatrick needs twenty four

(24) hours and Officer Hensley needs no additional hours at this time. (Officer Hensley just completed his training) Rumping will get ten hours (10).

The following agreed to attend the Peace Officers Training Course at Southern Hills Vocational School. Blanton one hundred and thirty two hours (132) Chief James Canter, one hundred and thirty two hours (132), Lonny Riley one hundred and thirty two hours (132). Officer Betty Kirkpatrick twenty four hours (24) and Mike Rumping ten hours (10). Officer Neel was not present however Chief Canter and Mayor Bowyer said they would talk to Officer Neel and tell him what was discussed.

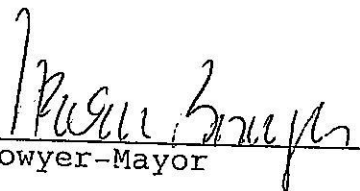
Chief Canter reported that Officers Blanton and Kirkpatrick and himself was willing to donate their time to attend the school if the village would use the money they would have been paid to pay for equipment on the new police cruise. Mayor Bowyer said he did not know if this could be done legally however he would talk with the village solicitor and report back at the next Council Meeting.

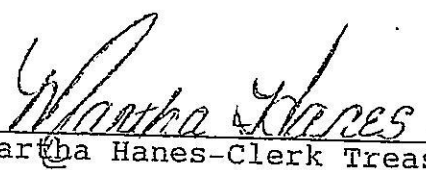
Mr. Neu motioned to have all the officers of the Hamersville Police Department attend the Brown County Peace Officers Training Academy at The Southern Hills Vocational School, and take the specified courses designated by the Village Council. Classes will begin on March 9, 1993. Chief Canter 132 hours, Officer Blanton 132 hours, Officer Riley 132 Hours, Officer Neel 132 hours, Officer Kirkpatrick 24 hours, Officer Rumping 10 hours (Officer Rumping is the training Officer for the village) Officer Hensley no hours at this time. Total hours to be paid for is 430 (Four Hundred and Thirty.) If a Class is missed due to extenuating circumstances, the officer will make the class up within one year of the date of the missed class at his own expense. This motion was seconded by Mr. Johnston. Voting: Neu: YEA, Johnston: YEA, Craig: YEA, Dean: YEA, Hanselman: YEA, Staggs: YEA. Voting: NAY: None. MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Neu said he had spoke with Gary Wise the Instructor at the Peace Officers Training School and Mr. Wise Had assured him that he would refund any fees that was paid and not used.

Mayor Bowyer asked if there was any further business to come before the meeting hearing none Mr. Dean motioned to adjourn seconded by Mr. Hanselman.

Mayor Bowyer adjourned the meeting reminding everyone that the next regular meeting will be held on Monday April 5, 1993 at 7:00 P.M.
