Regular Village Council Meeting
August 11, 2003

informed them that he has been putting the poster on the bulletin board, and it has been disappearing. The Shuemarks asked Mr. Staggs to discuss our options with the Sheriff.

Mr. Staggs has been getting a lot of complaints about the standing water. The farmers are draining their fields.

People are wanting to buy property in town, and replace the existing structure. Mr. Staggs wants to take these on a case by case basis. Mr. Ogle suggested that he tell anyone who wants to do this to come in and the Council will consider a variance.

Ms. Potts sent a letter to Ronnie Troxel. He phoned her office and left a nasty message for her. She suggested filing a complaint. She will call the prosecutor. The Council agreed on this course of action.

Mr. Staggs recognized Chief Canter. The Police Department found out who took all of the signs from the school. The school does not want to press charges against the juveniles as long as they pay for the signs, which the school has already replaced. The Chief then thanked Patrolmen Riley and Graham for their work. Chief Canter then gave the Council a good report on Patrolman Graham. Mr. Talbott made a motion to hire him at \$8.50 per hour beginning next pay period. Ms. Kirkpatrick seconded the motion, and it carried, all voting yes. Chief Canter informed the Council that the body armor is in.

Mr. Green will look for 50 gallon drums to serve as trash cans at the park. Mr. Green wants bathroom facilities at the park.

Mr. Ogle made a motion to adjourn, and Ms. Kirkpatrick seconded the motion. The motion carried, all voting yes.
