

HARRISVILLE VILLAGE COUNCIL

SEPTEMBER 11, 1989

Harrisville Village Council met in regular session with the following members present: ~~Richard~~ James Clark Moore, Larry Stephens, Jim Walker, Pat Henselman. Also present were Mayor Royer, Jim Carter, Benny Keeton, Len Ginn, Lyndal Steggs, Jim Henselman, John Stratman, Mr. Livia and Larry Elliott.

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Royer who in the absence of Clark Jim read the minutes from last meeting.

Motion to accept minutes as read by Henselman, Seconded by Stephens. Henselman appointed as interim clerk by Mayor. The floor was then turned over to Mr. John Stratman representing Jones and Henry Engineers Inc. Mr. Stratman had reviewed the latest sewage system proposal and plans and shared some of his thoughts on our situation. Discussion was open and many questions were raised about our options. Mr. Stratman was to meet with the City and in about 10 days and was going to raise some questions about our waste water problems/, specifically contribution of local waterways. He was also to check the village's current position on the EPA's priority list for funding. His findings were to be reported in writing to council or he would return at our next regular meeting.

Floor was then turned over Mr. Livia who had come to express his concerns and opinions about ordinance 1987 prohibiting mailboxes within the village. Mayor to investigate.

Mayor Royer and Chief Carter presented a recommendation to council to increase the following fines in the village:

- A. Disorderly conduct to 120.00
- B. Driving under suspension to 525.00
- C. 1st of Carter to 75.00
- D. No operators license to 525.00
- E. Reckless operation to 150.00
- F. Resisting Arrest to 750.00

Motion followed by Moore seconded by Stephens to increase fines as recommended by Mayor and Chief Carter, All aye.

Discussion was then held on failure of Mr. Roy says to pay for fire hydrant damaged in accident in March 1989. Mayor Royer to instruct solicitor Purdy to file suit against Mr. Says for damages on behalf of the village.

Resolution 1989-10 introduced to council to establish a fee schedule of the Brown Co. Solid Waste authority.
Motion by Walker and seconded by James to adopt resolution 1989-10, all aye.

Ordinance 1989-10 introduced to council to adopt 1989 c-11 supplement to the Ohio Revised Basic Code and Declaring an emergency. Motion by Moore to suspend rules and read by title only second by Stephens All aye.

Ordinance 1989-10 read three times by title only with motion by Henselman seconded by Walker All aye.

Ordinance 1989-11 introduced to council to establish salary for village council, village clerk and mayor. Council members to receive salary of 20.00 per meeting; village clerk to receive 125.00 per month, Mayor to receive salary of 45.00 per month all effective Jan 1, 1990. First reading was made.

Police report was given by Chief Carter. Discussion was held on time allowed to serve bench warrants and successful results were shown for these efforts. Council member Moore made a motion to allow the police dept. 10 additional hours in September to serve bench warrants seconded by Hanselman all aye.

Council discussed the possibility of granting ten additional hours to the police dept. for increased patrol. Moore made a motion to grant 10 additional hours to be added to the police dept schedule for the remainder of each month in 1989 seconded by Hanes all aye.

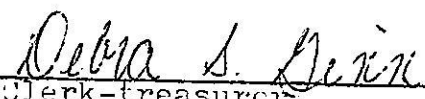
Mr. Mooten expressed a need for a new chain saw for the village Council requested that he gather some prices of a saw to fit his needs and present them at Oct. meeting
