

Village of Hamersville
 Regular Council Meeting
 June 1, 1992 7:00 P.M.

Present: Mayor Steven Bowyer, Clerk Treasurer Martha Hanes, Council Members William Dean Jr., James Johnston, Patrick Hanselman, Wyndal Staggs, Terry Stephens.

Also present: Chief James Canter, and Betty Kirkpatrick, Wayde Blanton of the Hamersville Police Dept.

Mack Hanes Board of Public Affairs and Karen Long, Justin Gibson, John Hall, John Long, Sarah Maynard, Shad Chambers, Pauline Thornton, William E. Helton, Annis Helton.

Also Present was Eugene O'Brien and Gene Worthington from O'Brien Engineering.

Mayor Bowyer called the meeting to order and asked for a motion to approve the minutes as presented for the meeting on May 4, 1992. Motion by Staggs, seconded by Stephens to accept the May 4, minutes as presented. Voteing: Staggs: YEA, Stephens: YEA, Dean: YEA, Hanselman: YEA, Johnston: YEA. Voteing Nay: None **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mayor Bowyer asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the May 5, 1992 meeting as presented. Hanselman motioned Johnston seconded motion to accept minutes of May 5, 1992 as presented. Voteing: Hanselman: YEA, Johnston: YEA, Dean: YEA, Staggs: YEA, Stephens: YEA. Voteing: Nay: None. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mayor Bowyer asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the May 6, 1992 meeting as presented. Stephens motioned, Hanselman seconded motion to accept the minutes of May 6, 1992 as presented. Voteing: Stephens: YEA, Hanselman: YEA, Dean: YEA, Johnston: YEA, Staggs: YEA. Voteing: NAY None. **MOTION CARRIED.**

A motion was made by Johnston seconded by Dean to appoint Martha Hanes as Village Clerk Treasurer retroactive from April 1, 1992. Voteing: Johnston: YEA, Dean: YEA, Hanselman: YEA, Staggs: YEA, Stephens: YEA. Voteing: Nay: None. **MOTION CARRIED.**

Mayor Bowyer brought up the subject of skateboards on the Village streets and sidewalks. Justin Gibson was recognized as the speaker for the group of youths assembled to hear this issue discussed before Council passes an ordinance on skate boards.'

Mayor Bowyer read ordinance 1992-8 An Ordinance Regulating The USE OF SKATEBOARDS WITHIN THE VILLAGE AND DECLARING IT AN EMERGENCY. Motion to suspend the rules and declare an emergency was made by Johnston, seconded by Hanselman. Voteing: Johnston: YEA, Hanselman: YEA, Dean: YEA, Staggs: YEA, Stephens: YEA. Voteing: Nay: None, **Motion Carried.** A motion was then made by Hanselman to adopt Ordinance 1992-8 (A Copy which will become part of these minutes) seconded by Staggs. Voteing: Hanselman: YEA, Staggs: YEA, Dean: YEA, Johnston: YEA, Stephens: YEA. Voteing: Nay: None. **MOTION CARRIED.** Ordinance 1992-8 becomes law immediately.

Mr. Hanselman reported that Mr. Johnson would start work on the park signs sometime this week, Hanselman has the lumber and will call him Tuesday or Wednesday.

Mr. Helton asked what the village was going to do about the condition of Dooley Ave. and when the village was going to repair this

street. Mayor Bowyer and members of council agreed that Dooley Ave. needed repairs and instructed Mr. Bunton to order some cold patch and fill the pot holes. Mr. Helton and the other residents from Dooley Ave. thanked council for their time and left the meeting.

Mayor Bowyer informed council that he has been working on a traffic light for route's 774 and 125.

There was a long discussion on the handicapped parking space in front of the store and members of council agreed to talk to Nancy Webber about this parking space.

Mayor Bowyer reported that he had sent letters to residents in regards to having their lots mowed. Bill Dean replied that he was to mow for Ed Dean and would do it just as quick as it got dry and he could get in to do it.

Council agreed to set village wide clean up day for June 24, 1992. Hanselman to put notice in the newspaper and Stephens to call Rumpke about getting them to pick up the extra garbage.

Mayor Bowyer reported that the villages request for issue 11 funding for Walnut St. and North Ave. had been denied.

Mr. Bunton entered the meeting at 8:10 P.M. and gave the report on the streets and asked what the village wanted the JTPA Workers to do. Mr. Bunton was instructed to order paint and Bill Dean will pick it up in the Tri County area for the village.

Mr. Hanselman to call Mr. Perry about sign posts that Mr. Perry has for sale.

Chief Canter Gave the report on the police department and discussed what the village thought about expanding the hours spent on patrol in the school zone in the early morning hours.

There was a discussion on the new game room opened by Marcia Weaver called "The Hang Out" and how the village would deal with the young people who hangs out after the curfew.

Chief Canter reported that Mr. Martin from Martin Industries in Georgetown had informed him that 95% of the radio equipment for the village was in and the remainder would be in shortly.

A motion was made by Staggs to purchase the new radio equipment for the police department not to exceed \$3,500.00 when complete.

Johnston seconded motion. Voteing: Staggs: YEA, Johnston: YEA, Dean: YEA, Hanselman: YEA, Stephens: YEA, Voteing: Nay None.

MOTION CARRIED.

Mayor Bowyer asked for a motion to pay the bills. A motion was made by Stephens seconded by Johnston to pay the bills as presented.

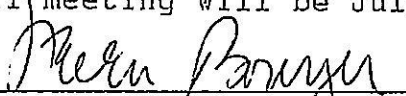

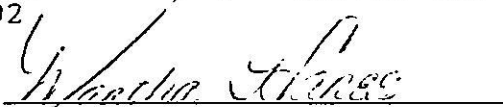
