

Village of Hamensville
Regular Council Meeting
202 Main St. Hamensville, Ohio
Monday April 6, 1992 7:00 P.M.

Present: Mayor Steven Bowyer, Patrick Hanselman, James Johnston, Wyndal Staggs, Terry Stephens, Clerk Treasurer Mantha Hanes.

William Dean Jr. entered the meeting at 7:20 P.M. and Larry Talbott entered at 7:50 P.M.

Also Present: James Carter, Edward Martin, Mack Hanes, Kathy Hannah, Mike Simpson, Lonny Riley, Betty Kirkpatrick, Jenny Johnson, Mr. Eugene O'Brein and Mr. Worthington entered the meeting at 8:25 P.M.

Mayor Steven Bowyer called the meeting to order and asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the February 24, 1992 council meeting. Motioned by Hanselman seconded by Johnston to accept the minutes. Voting: Hanselman-YEA, Johnston-YEA, Staggs-YEA, Stephens-YEA. Voting: NAY None. Motion Carried

Mayor Bowyer then asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the March 3, 1992 meeting as presented. Stephens motioned, Hanselman seconded to accept minutes as presented. Voting: Stephens-YEA, Hanselman-YEA, Staggs-YEA, Johnston-YEA. Voting-NAY None. Motion Carried.

Kathy Hannah addressed the council on the clerk of Mayor's count position and stated that she would like to keep the job, however she feels that she should be paid more money since she was cut back before during budget cuts and has not been brought back up to her old rate; she stated that she would also like to have regular raises when the police department receives them.

Mayor Bowyer asked if anyone wanted to make a motion to bring Kathy's pay rate back to her old amount effective April 1, 1992. Johnston motioned, Stephens seconded, to bring Kathy's pay rate back to her old amount of \$150.00 Per Month effective April 1, 1992. Voting: Johnston-YEA, Stephens-YEA, Staggs-YEA, Hanselman-YEA. Voting-NAY None. Motion Carried.

Kathy Hannah thanked the council for their time and left the meeting.

Mike Simpson addressed the council and stated that he had purchased the property from Tin Dyer on North Orchard St. and would like to fill in the ditch and wanted to know about dirt to fill it in. He has purchased 12 inch black pipe and was instructed to purchase the dirt and bring the paid bills to council and he will be reimbursed up to the allowed amount.

Mr. Simpson thanked council for their time and left the meeting.

Jenny Johnson addressed the council and questioned if it would not have been cheaper to add on to the building on Bank St. then to pay rent on the building on Main St. Mayor Bowyer and the members of council informed Mr. Johnson on how they felt the article in the papers was degrading and incorrect. Mr. Johnson indicated that he would print a new article and use some of the new information he had received at the meeting.

The park project was discussed and the need for signs was again brought up. Mr. Johnson said that he would be happy to make the signs if Mr. Hanselman would get with him and tell him what we wanted made. Mr. Hanselman will get the signs made.

Mayor Bowyer read ordinance 1992-4 for the second reading. this is an ordinance to increase electric rates in the village.

Mayor Bowyer discussed the need for a traffic light at State Route 125 and State Route 774. this would be a trip light based on the traffic flow. Mayor Bowyer to draft a letter to Cooper Snyder, Doug White and Bob McEwen and the Ohio Department of Transportation about this needed light.

Resolution 1992-5. A resolution to call all the outstanding Water Works Bonds as of June 1, 1992.

Motion by Dean, seconded by Talbott to call the Water Works Bonds as of June 1, 1992. Voting: Dean-YEA, Talbott-YEA, Hanselman-YEA, Johnston-YEA, Staggs-YEA, Stephens-YEA. Voting — NAY none. Motion Carried.

Motion was made by Hanselman seconded by Johnston to have Mayor Steven Bowyer proclaim May 7, 1992 as National World Day Of Prayer. Voting: Hanselman-YEA, Johnston-YEA, Dean-YEA, Staggs-YEA, Stephens-YEA, Talbott-YEA. Voting nay- None. Motion Carried.

Mr. Bunton entered the meeting and gave the report on the streets. He stated that he needed round up and a slow moving vehicle sign. Council instructed Mr. Bunton to order the sign and to get the round up.

The Street committee was instructed to look at the yellow lines in front of the Downing residence on Main St. and to check and see how many curbs will need painting this summer.

Johnston discussed the need for a new police radio and how the Village should consider using some of the money being returned from the Water Works Bonds to purchase a new radio for the police dept.

Council was in agreement not to make any commitments for these funds until they are received.

Chief Canter gave the police report at this time, and the fifteen minute parking by the post office was discussed.

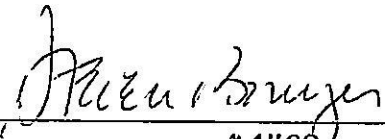
The street committee is to look at changing the signs to read 15 minute parking 8:00A.M. to 6:00 P.M. They will report on this at the next council meeting.

Mayor Bowyer asked for a motion to pay the bills as presented. Motioned by Johnston seconded by Staggs to pay all bills. Voteing: Johnston-YEA, Staggs-YEA, Dean-YEA, Hanselman-YEA, Stephens-YEA, Talbott-YEA. Voteing nay- none. Motion Carried.

Mr. O'Brien and Mr. Worthington discussed the sewer project and what the Village must do next if they want to proceed with this project. Talbott motioned, seconded by Hanselman to file a preliminary application with Farmers Home Administration for a sewer project loan. Voteing: Talbott YEA, Hanselman-YEA, Dean-YEA, Johnston-YEA, Staggs-YEA, Stephens-YEA. Voteing nay- None. Motion Carried.

Mayor Bowyer asked if there was any further business to come before the meeting? Hearing none Hanselman motioned Talbott seconded, to adjourn the meeting. Voteing: Hanselman-YEA, Talbott-YEA, Dean-YEA, Johnston-YEA, Staggs-YEA, Stephens-YEA. Voteing nay-None. Motion Carried.

Mayor Bowyer adjourned the meeting reminding all council members that the next meeting will be Monday May 4, 1992 at 7:00 P.M.
