- Possible actions that can be taken with blighted properties in the Village
- \$3,000.00 grant to be received for Mobile Data Terminals (MDT) for the police department.
- Parking lot has been re-stripped by the maintenance staff

To approve the purchase of Mobile Data Terminals (MDT) for the police department.

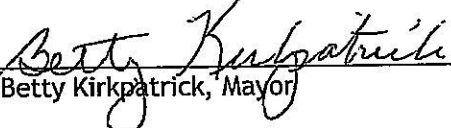

New/Old Business

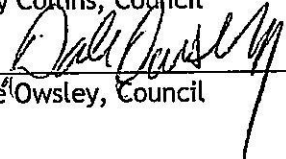
Mr. Sutton recommended petitioning the State to allow villages to collect sales tax. A brief discussion ensued regarding the implementation of sales tax versus an income tax.

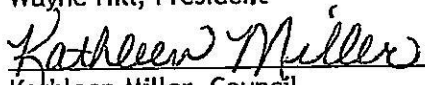
There being no further business, Ms. Miller made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Mr. Owsley. The motion passed with all voting yes.
