Regular Village Council Meeting
August 12, 2002

Present: Mayor Duane C. Neu, Larry Talbott, Wyndal Staggs, Diana Shuemaker, Betty Kirkpatrick, Kevin Ogle and Clerk Treasurer Tammie Ogle.

Also Present: Carolyn and Gary Donner, Jake & Crystal Haas, Cecelia Potts, Police Chief Jim Canter, Kenny and Jesse Green, Scott Lanter, Hollee Chadwick and Phil Patton.

Mayor Neu called this meeting to order at 7:00 p.m., then asked Mr. Talbott to lead the assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor Neu then swore in Mr. Ogle as Council Member.

Mayor Neu then recognized Mr. And Mrs. Donner. Mrs. Donner is interested in a seat on either the Council or the BPA.

Mayor Neu recognized Mr. And Mrs. Haas, who came to observe the meeting, as well as thank the Police Department for the job they are doing. The Council thanked them for coming in.

The Clerk Treasurer presented the minutes from the previous meeting. Mr. Staggs made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Mr. Talbott seconded the motion, and the motion carried, all members voting yes.

Ms. Kirkpatrick made a motion to pay all bills as presented. Ms. Shuemake seconded the motion, and the motion carried, all members voting yes.

Ms. Shuemake asked about the situation on Fite concerning the ditching. Mr. Staggs informed the Council that the people in town want to use plastic culverts instead of corrugated. We have an Ordinance against plastic. Mr. Staggs made a motion to suspend the rules for reading an Ordinance three times. Mr. Talbott seconded the motion, and the motion carried, all members voting yes. Mr. Talbott made a motion to rescind the Ordinance restricting plastic pipes. Mr. Staggs seconded the motion, and the motion carried, all voting yes. There needs to be an 18" plastic pipe on Mr. Bibb's property.

Kenny has ordered the sewer pump for Dale Clark.

Ms. Potts presented a Resolution for the transfer of funds from the Computer Fund. Mr. Talbott made a motion to adopt Resolution #2002-03. Ms. Shuemake seconded the motion, and the motion carried, all members voting yes.

Mr. Staggs told Jesse that he is doing a fine job keeping things mowed.

Mayor Neu read Ms. Scott's resignation from the Board of Public Affairs. Mr. Staggs made a motion to accept the resignation, and Mr. Talbott seconded the motion. The motion carried, all voting yes.

Chief Canter informed the Council that the blue house on Main Street is dangerous. Phil took pictures that show cockroaches, electric hanging out of the walls and ceilings, and other problems. Phil will contact the State Fire Marshall about getting it condemned. The Police Garage needs work as soon as possible. The Chief then asked the Council to decide who we are going to buy the extras for the Police car from. Mr. Talbott made a motion to buy them from Martin, and Ms. Shuemake seconded the motion. The vote was as follows: Ms. Shuemake-yes, Ms. Kirkpatrick-yes, Mr. Talbott-yes, Mr. Staggs-abstain and Mr. Ogle-no. Mr. Ogle wanted to see the other quotes, which were not made available to him. The motion carried. Mr. Talbott made a motion to accept a quote from Patriot Sign for decals for \$290.00. Mr. Staggs seconded the motion, and it carried, all voting yes. In the last month the Police Department has had several death threats. Chief Canter asked for Caller I.D. to try to stop it. Phil asked for

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Distinctive Ring as well. Mr. Ogle made a motion to get Caller I.D. for the Police Department. Mr. Talbott seconded the motion, and the motion carried, all members voting yes. Chief Canter wants to do a fingerprinting program for the children in town. Mr. Ogle made a motion for the police Department to look into the Identakid program. Ms. Kirkpatrick seconded the motion, and the motion carried, all voting yes. Mr. Talbott told the Police Department that they have been doing a good job.

Mr. Staggs again complained about his neighbors who are a nuisance. Every word out of their mouths is an obscenity. All of the neighbors are getting tired of it. His Grandson can't go outside to play. Chief Canter told Council that they cite them to court, and they pay all of their fines every time. Mr. Staggs asked the Chief if he could buy a video camera to record them. The Chief told him he would cite them.

Phil wants more hours and more money. He would like the Village to go after a grant. Ms. Shuemaker will check the internet.

The Ohio Bicentennial is coming up next year. The Council appointed a Bicentennial Committee made up of Ms. Kirkpatrick and Ms. Shuemaker to make plans for some sort of ceremony. They are considering a picnic.

Mr. Ogle made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Staggs seconded the motion, and the motion carried, all members voting yes.
