

ORDINANCE NO. 237

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING MAIL BOXES ON THE VILLAGE
STREETS AND ALLEYS IN HAMERSVILLE, OHIO.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Hamersville,
Brown County, Ohio, three-fourths or more of all members elected
thereto concurring, as follows:

SECTION I. That no mail boxes shall be erected on any village
alley or village street within the corporate limits of the Village
of Hamersville, Ohio, after the effective date of this Ordinance.

SECTION II. That anyone violating this Ordinance shall be
subject to a fine of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) or more
than Twenty-Five dollars (\$25.00) and each day that said mail
box is allowed to remain on a street or alley shall be considered
a separate offense.

SECTION III. That this ordinance shall be in full force
from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
