

Hamersville Village Council
Regular Session
February 5, 1990 - 7:00 P.M.
Hamersville Community Building

Mayor Bowyer called the meeting to order.

Present were: Martha Hanes, Pat Hanselman, Chuck Moore,
Wyndal Staggs, and Terry Stephens

Also present were: Joyce Craig, Jim Canter, Dennie Wooten,
James Walker, George Leicht. Debra Ginn
came in during the meeting.

Clerk-Treasurer read the minutes of the January 2, 1990 meeting
and January 31, 1990 meeting. Stephens moved to accept the
minutes as read. Moore seconded the motion.

VOTING: YEAS: Stephens, Moore, Hanes, Hanselman, Staggs
NAYS: None **MOTION CARRIED**

Mayor Bowyer informed Council of a C.G. & E. Dinner meeting
to be held in February and asked if anyone would like to attend.
There will also be a seminar in March for Village Mayors and
Clerks. Mayor Bowyer requested a Finance Committee meeting
for February 13, 1990 at 7:00 p.m. At this point, Mayor Bowyer
presented plaques to James Walker and Debra Ginn in appreciation
for their years of community service, also a planted was given
to Debra. Mr. Walker thanked the Council and left the meeting.

Discussion was held on purchasing a gasoline tank for Village
use from the Batavia Local School District. It is a 500 gallon,
above ground tank with electric pump and electric motor. The
tank is in good shape but would need a coat of paint. Councilman
Stephens said he thought the tank could be purchased for at
least \$200.00, perhaps even less. Based upon the potential
savings to the Village by purchasing bulk gasoline, Staggs
moved that Council purchase the tank from Batavia Local School.
Hanes seconded the motion.

VOTING: YEAS: Staggs, Hanes, Moore, Hanselman
Abstained: Stephens

Mayor Bowyer brought council up-to-date on Board of Public
Affairs meeting. Jim Hanselman was elected President, Charles
Tucker was appointed and Eric Mullis will accept vacant position
on the Board. Board is also interested in purchasing lot from
Tony Richey. Board requested an ordinance be prepared to have
\$950.00 per month plus interest be put in the Improvement &
Replacement Fund.

Mayor Bowyer told Council the Police Committee had met. The
Committee recommended a 5% across the board raise for Police
Department, mainly because they have not had a raise in the
past three years. Also, Police Department requested an additional
ten hours per month, plus Department would like to purchase
a camera.

Mr. Moore said he had a brand new camera he would donate to
the Police Department.

Mayor Bowyer said that Mr. Rumpling has always let our Police Officers have the use of the shooting range at the gun club he belongs to and we have never paid him. Council agreed we should pay Mr. Rumpling \$25.00 for instructor fee.

Discussion on Police salaries began. Stephens moved that Council go into Executive Session. Hanes seconded the motion.

VOTING: YEAS: Stephens, Hanes, Hanselman, Moore, Staggs.
Motion by Hanes to come out of Executive Session. Hanselman seconded the motion. **MOTION CARRIED**

Ordinance 1990-6 for Police salary increase, effective February 1, 1990, was introduced. Motion by Hanes, seconded by Stephens to suspend the rules and read by title only three times. **VOTING:** YEAS: Hanes, Stephens, Hanselman, Moore

Abstained: Staggs

Ordinance 1990-6 will stand as first reading.

Stephens made motion to accept donation of camera valued at approximately \$70.00. Hanselman seconded the motion.

VOTING: YEAS: Stephens, Hanselman, Hanes, Moore, Staggs
NAYS: None **MOTION CARRIED**

Moore moved, Hanes seconded the motion to include ten extra hours per month for Police Department for entire year.

VOTING: YEAS: Moore, Hanes, Hanselman, Staggs, Stephens
NAYS: None **MOTION CARRIED**

Police Chief Canter gave his report for the month of January.

Street Committee reported several streets in the Village are in need of repairs. Hanselman moved, Stephens seconded the motion for Mr. Wooten to purchase cold patch.

VOTING: YEAS: Hanselman, Stephens, Hanes, Moore, Staggs
NAYS: None **MOTION CARRIED**

The parking situation at the Post Office was discussed again. Perhaps purchasing and installing signs, plus painting of yellow lines could alleviate part of the problem.

Clerk-Treasurer Craig read the bills. Moore moved, Hanes seconded the motion to approve bills.

VOTING: YEAS: Moore, Hanes, Hanselman, Stephens, Staggs
NAYS: None **MOTION CARRIED**

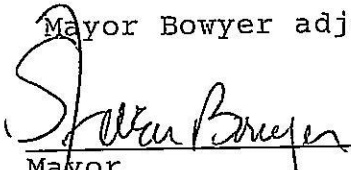
Councilman Hanselman stated to the Council he would like to see a couple more street lights installed by the school.

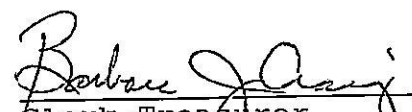
Next regular meeting to be held March 5, 1990 at 7:00 p.m.
