

August 13, 2007, cont'd.

Mayor Staggs will continue to try to get bids for painting lines & stops on the streets.

Mayor Staggs informed the Council that Clark Township cut the grass on Wooster for the Village.

Dollar General opened this morning. The Grand Opening is scheduled for September 1.

Mr. Staggs made a motion to approve a Supplemental Appropriation from 2011-620-396 to 2011- 620-190, in the amount of \$10,000.00. Mr. Tolliver seconded the motion, and it carried, all voting yes.

Mr. Talbott brought up that he has been approached about the "push for an income tax". He wants people to understand that no one pushed for an income tax. It was just an option that Council considered in order to remain autonomous.

Mayor Staggs recognized Ed Saylor, who came to ask about an overall variance for the animal ordinance. Ms. Potts told him that while the Council can vote on a variance, it is by each request, not just overall. Mayor Staggs asked if there was a motion for a variance, and Ms. Kirkpatrick made a motion for a variance to allow Mr. Saylor not more than 7 horses. Mr. Shouse seconded the motion, and roll call vote resulted as follows:

Mr. Staggs-No
Mr. Tolliver-No
Mr. Day-No
Mr. Talbott-No
Ms. Kirkpatrick-Yes
Mr. Shouse-Yes

The motion did not carry. Mr. Saylor asked if the Council abides by Roberts rules of order, and Ms. Potts told him it was done under Ohio Municipal League rules. Mr. Saylor told the Council that if it is not reconsidered again, he will take further recourse, including legal action and adding other livestock just outside of Municipal limits. He also told Council that there would come a time when the Council members would change, and the new members would be able to overturn this decision.

Chief Canter told the Council about the recent vandalism and break-ins. He thanked the Mayor and Mr. Staggs for their help. We have 4 indictments and expect more. He also thanked the Sheriff's office for their support. Mayor Staggs called and thanked the Sheriff personally.

The Board recommended a \$1.00 raise for Skip. Mr. Talbott made a motion to Raise Skip's pay \$1.00 per hour to \$12.00, retroactive to August 1, 2007. Mr. Tolliver seconded the motion, and it carried, all voting yes.
