**BOARD OF PUBLIC AFFAIRS
REGULAR MEETING
MONDAY, DECEMBER 18, 1995**

PRESENT: Mack Hanes, Edward Martin Jr. Martha Hanes Clerk Treasurer,

Also present: Ms. Kay Elliott, Mr. Colby Saylor, and Mr. Lynn Dunn.

President Hanes called the meeting to order at 7:05 P.M.

Mr. Martin motioned to accept the minutes of the previous meeting as presented.

Mr. Hanes seconded the motion. All voted Yea. Motion Carried.

Mr. Martin motioned to pay the bills as presented and Mr. Hanes seconded the motion. All voted Yea. MOTION CARRIED.

Lynn Dunn reported that C.G. & E was still kicking around the idea of selling a portion of their line in the village to the village. Mr. Dunn said that he thinks the price will be around Two Thousand Dollars (\$2000.00) to Twenty Five Hundred Dollars. (\$2500.00) Mr. Dunn stated that the village will need to string a new line from the sub station to behind the school sometime in the near future.

Mr. Dunn questioned if the truck moving the double wide home that tore down the electric lines had reimbursed the village.

The clerk to send all the information to the village solicitor.

Mr. Dunn turned in a bill to the clerk for diesel fuel for the electric truck.

Mr. Martin questioned if the trailer on Dooley Alley has a septic system? Mr.

Martin said someone from the mobile home is carrying water from the house to the mobile home.

Mr. Dunn reported that the snow blade on the truck had been repaired and the village is now ready for the snow...

Mr. Saylor questioned if perhaps we should go back to using metal lids on the water meter wells. The lids we are now using are breaking from being run over.

Mr. Saylor was instructed to check with Win-Water Works and Water works Supply for price comparison. Mr. Saylor to order eight (8) lids from the cheapest supplier.

Ms. Elliott reported that she had sent out seventy eight (78) cut off notices.

The village had one (1) new water tap from Travis Day on Liming Van Thompson Road.

Mr. Dunn reported that he had repaired the street light at the corner of Park Avenue and Wooster Avenue.

There was a discussion on how to work the sewer taps and fees on the vacant lots in the village.

Once the sewer financing is in place there will need to be several very serious policy making meetings to iron out the facts on sewers.

Mr. Hanes said there had been no leaks in the water lines to his knowledge.

It was questioned if Mr. Van Harlingen had run all the tests necessary to keep the village in good standing with EPA since no one in the village had see the notice run in the News Democrat.

Mr. Hanes to call Mr. Van Harlingen about this matter.

Mr. Hanes asked if there was any further business to come before the meeting; hearing none Mr. Martin motioned to adjourn. All Voted YEA. MOTION CARRIED.

Mr. Hanes adjourned the meeting reminding everyone that the next meeting will be held on Monday January 15, 1996 at 7:00 P.M.
