

ORDINANCE NO. 1981-4

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING, ADOPTING, AND ENACTING ANDERSON'S REVISED OHIO BASIC CODE AS THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE.

WHEREAS, The present general and permanent ordinances of the Village are inadequately arranged and classified and are insufficient in form and substance for the complete preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the municipality and for the proper conduct of its affairs.

WHEREAS, The American Legal Publishing Co. publishes a Code of Ordinances suitable for adoption by villages in Ohio.

WHEREAS, It is necessary to provide for the usual daily operation of the municipal departments, and for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety that this ordinance take effect at an early date; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMERSVILLE, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. Anderson's Revised Ohio Basic Code, as reviewed and approved by Council is adopted and enacted.

Section 2. One copy of Anderson's Revised Ohio Basic Code, certified as correct by the Mayor and Clerk of Council, as required by § 731.23 of the Revised Code of Ohio, shall be kept in its initial form on file in the Office of the Clerk of the Village and retained as a permanent ordinance record of the Village. The Clerk is authorized and directed to publish a summary of all new matters contained in the Code of Ordinances as required by § 731.23.

Section 3. This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the peace, health, and safety of the people of Hamersville, and shall take effect at the earliest date provided by law.

LEGAL NOTICE

Notice is hereby given that on the 6th day of April, 1981, there was enacted by the Council of the Village of Hamersville, Ohio an ordinance entitled "AN ORDINANCE APPROVING, ADOPTING, AND ENACTING ANDERSON'S REVISED OHIO BASIC CODE."

A summary of the subjects, including all new matters contained in the Code of Ordinances, as adopted, follows:

TITLE I: GENERAL PROVISIONS

Chapter 10. General Provisions. This chapter contains general provisions and rules of construction that are operative throughout the code.

Chapter 11. Ordinances Repealed and Saved. This chapter lists ordinances of the municipality specifically saved and those specifically repealed by adoption of the code.

TITLE III: ADMINISTRATION

Chapter 30. General Provisions. This chapter contains the general provisions of state law dealing with village officials.

Chapter 31. Executive. This chapter contains the provisions of state law which deal with the executive branch of village government.

Chapter 32. Legislative. This chapter contains provisions of state law which deal with the legislative branch of village government.

Chapter 33. Judicial. This chapter contains provisions of state law which deal with the judicial branch of village government.

Chapter 34. Police Department. This chapter contains provisions from state law setting forth the powers and duties of the police department.

Chapter 35. Fire Department. This chapter contains provisions from state law setting forth the powers and duties of the fire department.

TITLE VII: TRAFFIC CODE

Chapter 70. General Provisions. This chapter contains provisions applicable to the entire title.

Chapter 71. Licensing Provisions. This chapter contains provisions from state law governing licensing of vehicles and operators.

Chapter 72. Traffic Rules. This chapter contains provisions from state law governing the operation of vehicles.

Chapter 73. Motor Vehicle Crimes. This chapter contains provisions from state law prohibiting certain conduct in regard to vehicles.

Chapter 74. Equipment and Loads. This chapter contains provisions from state law regulating motor vehicle equipment and loads.

Chapter 75. Bicycles and Motorcycles. This chapter contains provisions from state law regulating the operation of bicycles and motorcycles.

Chapter 76. Parking Regulations. This chapter contains provisions from state law regulating parking.

TITLE IX: GENERAL REGULATIONS

Chapter 90. Animals. This chapter contains regulations dealing with animals running at large and offenses relating to domestic animals.

Chapter 91. Fireworks, Explosives, Fire Prevention. This chapter contains regulations dealing with fireworks, explosives, and fire prevention.

Chapter 92. Intoxicating Liquors. This chapter contains provisions from state law regulating sale and consumption of intoxicating liquor.

Chapter 93. Nuisances. This chapter contains regulations dealing with unclean habitations; privy vaults, cesspools, and refuse; weeds and litter; trees and leaves.

Chapter 94. Sanitation and Health. This chapter contains regulations concerning food and food handlers and communicable diseases.

Chapter 95. Streets and Sidewalks. This chapter contains regulations concerning streets and sidewalks.

TITLE XI: BUSINESS REGULATIONS

Chapter 110. General Provisions. This chapter contains the general provisions applicable to businesses in the village.

Chapter 111. Taxicabs. This chapter contains regulations governing the operation of taxicabs in the village.

Chapter 112. Vendors and Peddlers. This chapter contains regulations governing vendors and peddlers in the village.

Chapter 113. Commercial Amusements. This chapter contains regulations governing public entertainments and other commercial amusements.

TITLE XIII: GENERAL OFFENSES

Chapter 130. General Provisions. This chapter contains definitions and provisions generally applicable throughout the title.

Chapter 131. Offenses Against Property. This chapter contains provisions prohibiting certain acts involving property.

Chapter 132. Offenses Against Public Peace. This chapter contains provisions prohibiting certain acts which disturb the peace.

Chapter 133. Offenses Against Morals. This chapter contains definitions and prohibitions involving morals offenses.

Chapter 134. Gambling. This chapter contains definitions, prohibitions, and regulations concerning gambling.

Chapter 135. Offenses Against Persons. This chapter contains provisions prohibiting certain acts which endanger persons.

Chapter 136. Offenses Against Justice and Administration. This chapter contains provisions prohibiting certain acts which interfere with justice and administration.

Chapter 137. Weapons Control. This chapter contains provisions regulating the use and possession of weapons.

Chapter 138. Drug Offenses. This chapter contains provisions regulating the use, sale, and possession of specified drugs.

Chapter 139. Miscellaneous. This chapter contains regulations concerning sanitation and health.
