

ORDINANCE NO. 1982-3

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR LEGAL COUNSEL FOR THE
FORMER MAYOR OF THE VILLAGE OF HAMERSVILLE, BROWN
COUNTY, OHIO.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Hamersville, Brown County, Ohio, three-fourths (3/4) or more of all members thereof concurring as follows:

SECTION I. That one Ernest L. Wilson has filed a Complaint in the Common Pleas Court of Brown County, Ohio, against Duane C. Neu, Box 1706, Hamersville, Ohio 45130, and the Village of Hamersville, Box 1786, Hamersville, Ohio 45130; and,

SECTION II. WHEREAS, the Complaint for damages in this action, being Case No. 82CV28778, asks for damages in the amount of \$25,000.00 to compensate the Plaintiff for his great losses and the sum of \$50,000.00 for punitive damages; and,

SECTION III. WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Hamersville, Ohio, has agreed to pay part of the attorney fees incurred by Duane C. Neu, individually, for the reason that the damages complained of in this Complaint and action in the Common Pleas Court of Brown County, Ohio, arose as a result of Duane C. Neu acting in his official capacity as mayor of the Village of Hamersville, Ohio.

SECTION IV. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Hamersville, Brown County, Ohio, that the Village shall furnish legal counsel to Duane C. Neu in defense of the within action and complaint. The attorney employed by Duane C. Neu shall be paid at the rate of \$50.00 per hour, with the maximum amount the Village will pay as attorney fees for Duane C. Neu not to exceed \$400.00. This Ordinance providing for payment of attorney fees for the former mayor shall be in addition to extraordinary services rendered by the other counsel to the Village of Hamersville, Ohio, who is also a Defendant in this action.

SECTION V. This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the proper defense of the lawsuit filed by Ernest L. Wilson against Duane C. Neu and the

Village of Hamersville, Ohio, and that it is necessary to obtain counsel immediately without further delay, and this Ordinance shall be in immediate effect upon its passage.
