

Village of Hamersville
Regular Meeting - Council
May 6, 1991 - 7:00 P.M.

Present: Steve Bowyer, J.R. Elliott, Martha Hanes, Pat Hanselman, Chuck Moore, Terry Stephens.

Absent: Wyndal Staggs

Also present: Jim Canter, Joyce Craig, Dennie Wooten, Dallas Hurt, George Leicht and visitors of the community.

Mayor Bowyer called the meeting to order and asked if there were any corrections to the minutes of the regular meeting of April 1, 1991. Moore moved, Hanes seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the April 1, 1991 meeting. **VOTING: YEA: Moore, Hanes, Elliott, Hanselman, Stephens NAY: None MOTION CARRIED**

Mayor Bowyer asked if there were any additions or corrections to the minutes of the special meeting of April 5, 1991. Hanes moved, Stephens seconded the motion to approve the minutes of the April 5th meeting. **VOTING: YEA: Hanes, Stephens, Elliott, Hanselman, Moore NAY: None MOTION CARRIED**

Terry Stephens introduced Mr. Dallas Hurt of Gradison & Company. Terry explained to Council that Gradison & Company had the lowest bid for our 1st renewal of Street Improvement Bond Anticipation Notes. Gradison & Company bid 5.00% for \$40,000.00 Notes.

Mayor Bowyer introduced Ordinance 1991-16, An Ordinance providing Issuance of \$40,000.00 of Notes in Anticipation of the Issuance of Bonds for the Purpose of Improving Streets in the Village and declaring it an Emergency. Hanes moved, Elliott seconded the motion to suspend the rules and read by Title Only Ordinance 1991-16. **VOTING: YEA: Hanes, Elliott, Hanselman, Moore, Stephens NAY: None MOTION CARRIED**

Following discussion, Moore moved, Hanes seconded the motion to adopt Ordinance 1991-16. **VOTING: YEA: Moore, Hanes, Elliott, Hanselman, Stephens NAY: None MOTION CARRIED**

Mayor Bowyer asked the visitors if they had any comments or questions to bring before Council. Mr. Martin had questions about mowing of lots. Mayor Bowyer informed Mr. Martin that the Village does have an ordinance on mowing. Also, that the Village publishes a notice in the News Democrat and mails letter to residents in violation of the ordinance. Mr. Martin thanked the Council for their time and left the meeting.

Mr. Hacker said he was present because he can not park his vehicles in front of his own home on Bank Street. Mayor Bowyer explained to Mr. Hacker that the Village has declared "No Parking" on either side of Bank street due to the fact the emergency vehicles use

this street. Mr. Hacker said it was very inconvenient when his family and friends come to visit. Council told Mr. Hacker he could use the alley in back of Jewell's Garage for parking. Council may consider purchasing gravel for the alley. Mr. Hacker thanked Council for their time and left the meeting.

Mr. Clark questioned the ordinance regarding unlicensed vehicles in own driveway. Mayor Bowyer informed Mr. Clark that Village does have an ordinance regarding this issue. Council answered Mr. Clark's questions. Mr. Clark then left the meeting.

Ordinance 1991-7 Accepting Improvement to Wayne Avenue & Adkins Place & Dedication of Water Line was read for the third time. Stephens moved, Hanselman seconded the motion to adopt Ordinance 1991-7. VOTING: YEA: Stephens, Hanselman, Elliott, Hanes, Moore NAY: None MOTION CARRIED

The Third reading of Ordinance 1991-8 An Ordinance Vacating a Portion of Wayne Avenue was tabled at this time.

Roof repairs were again discussed. Mayor will talk with Township Trustees.

Discussion was held on disposal of tree limbs. Council decided to let Rumpke Waste Removal continue to handle disposition of tree limbs.

Mayor Bowyer presented Dennie Wooten with an appreciation plaque for his years of service for the Village. Mr. Wooten thanked Council and left the meeting.

Mayor Bowyer introduced Ordinance 1991-17 An Ordinance Authorizing the Board of Public Affairs to Enter into a Contract with Suncraft Construction Company for Repairs to the Village Water Storage Tank and declaring an Emergency. Hanselman moved to suspend the rules and read by Title Only Ordinance 1991-17. Elliott seconded the motion. VOTING: YEA: Hanselman, Elliott, Hanes, Moore, Stephens NAY: None MOTION CARRIED

Following discussion Hanes moved, Elliott seconded the motion to adopt Ordinance 1991-17. VOTING: YEA: Hanes, Elliott, Hanselman, Moore, Stephens NAY: None MOTION CARRIED

At this point, Chuck Moore submitted his resignation to Council. Mr. Moore has sold his home and will be moving from the Village. Hanselman moved (regretfully) to accept Mr. Moore's resignation. Elliott seconded the motion. VOTING: YEA: Hanselman, Elliott, Hanes, Stephens NAY: None MOTION CARRIED Mr. Moore's resignation is effective May 7, 1991

Mayor Bowyer read a letter stating that May 15th had been designated

as observance of Peace Officer Memorial Day. It was consensus of opinion of Council to abide by this observance.

Chief Canter gave his report for April. Police Cruiser needs paint repair. Council told Chief Canter to go ahead and have cruiser repaired.

Mr. Bunton told Council that the Village needed a weed eater. Moore moved, Hanes seconded the motion for Mr. Bunton to purchase a weed trimmer. **VOTING: YEA: Moore, Hanes, Elliott, Hanselman, Stephens NAY: None MOTION CARRIED**

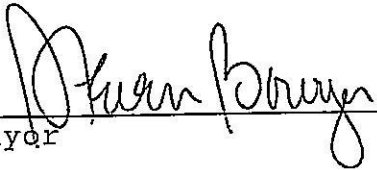
Council instructed Mr. Bunton to see if he can trade in the 2 used trimmers we currently have.

Mr. Bunton requested safety equipment for his protection while working on the streets. Council told Mr. Bunton to order whatever he needed.

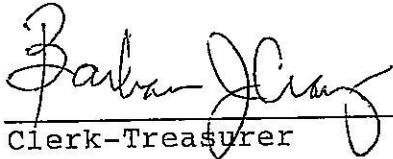
